A two-wheel Journey to the EAC Integration.



The Great African Cycling Safari (GACS) is an annual 55-day cycling event that has played a vital role in promoting East African Community (EAC) integration while addressing critical regional issues. With a unique blend of cycling and social engagement, GACS brings together cyclists from across East Africa and beyond, who traverse multiple countries while participating in community outreach activities. These include school engagements, public-private dialogues, tree planting, environmental conservation efforts, peace-building initiatives, and awareness campaigns.

GACS, a 55-day, 6,000-kilometer bicycle tour throughout East Africa, is the longest endurance event in Africa. It seeks to fast-track the EAC integration process and raise awareness about issues affecting the people of East Africa.





Background & Evolution

Inception: The Great African Cycling Safari (GACS) began in 2016 as the East African Bicycle Tour, popularly known as Tour De EAC. In 2021, it was rebranded to better reflect its expanded vision—"Great African" embodies the aspiration of uniting Africa through cycling, while "Safari" reflects the continent's identity and spirit of adventure.

Rotating Hosts: Each year, GACS is hosted by a different EAC Partner State, showcasing the diverse cultures and strengths of each nation.

Broadening Focus: Originally centered on regional cooperation, GACS has expanded its focus to include contemporary issues such as climate change, food security, and peace-building.

Route Coverage: The event traditionally passes through multiple EAC partner states, including Kenya, Uganda, Rwanda, Burundi, and Tanzania, with future expansion planned to include South Sudan, Somalia, and the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) as conditions permit.

Diverse Participation: Cyclists from all EAC partner states, as well as participants from other African and European regions, take part in the expedition. A core team completes the full journey, while others join for specific segments.




GACS and EAC Integration:

- Regional Integration & Fast-Tracking EAC Integration: GACS plays a vital role in advancing EAC integration by actively demonstrating the free movement of goods, persons, and services. Through its cross-border engagements, the event brings to life the principles of the EAC Common Market Protocol, fostering seamless regional connectivity and cooperation.
- Regional Peace & Security: GACS fosters dialogue and interaction among diverse East African communities, promoting mutual understanding and unity through PPDs (Public-Private Dialogues), peace-building workshops, and cross-border engagements.
- Food Security & Safety: GACS conducts surveys, educational programs, and strategic partnerships to improve food production, nutrition, and sustainability across East Africa.
- Tourism: GACS seeks to establish East Africa as the leading bicycle tourism destination by highlighting its non-traditional tourist destinations, pristine landscapes, vibrant cultures, and rich traditions. It offers adventurers authentic experiences beyond mainstream tourist trails.

Operations - 2025 Preliminary Route & Goals



Theme: Climate Change, PEACE & FOOD SECURITY.

- 5 Countries, 55 Days
- Start and Finish in Kigali
- 49 Riding Stages, ~6430 km
- Ensure route passes locations that support/reinforce the theme areas
 - O Start Aug 1
 - O Finish Sept 25
- Non-cycling Events & activities held in >50% of overnight locations
- Goal of 40 Riders to complete the full tour with 30% female.
- Plant 13 Community forests, hold 2 PPDs, 30 workshops.
